
RE: STATEWIDE SURVEY—NORTH DAKOTA



Nearly everyone is tuned in to the confirmation of Brett Kavanaugh to the Supreme Court.

Kavanaugh Nomination:

Seen, Read, Heard: A Lot/Some



Voters across the country are paying close attention to the nomination and confirmation process of Judge Kavanaugh. North Dakota is no exception, with nearly three-quarters (73%) reporting that they have seen, read, or heard "a lot" about the process and another 21% saying they have heard "some."

By a substantial margin, voters in North Dakota want to see Kavanaugh confirmed.

A solid majority (56%) want to see Kavanaugh on the Supreme Court, while only 26% are opposed.


Kavanaugh not only has the strong support of Republicans, but also the majority of Independents and women as well.

Kavanaugh has come across as more believable than his accuser, Christine Blasey Ford.

Kavanaugh/Ford: Believable?



Sixty-five percent (65%) of voters found Kavanaugh's testimony believable compared to 47% for Ford. When asked to choose who they found more believable, voters again choose Kavanaugh by a substantial margin, including women.

METHODOLOGY

Public Opinion Strategies conducted a statewide telephone survey of 756 voters in North Dakota. The margin of error is $\pm 3.56\%$. Interviews were collected September 27-29, 2018 following the testimonies of Christine Blasey Ford and Brett Kavanaugh.
